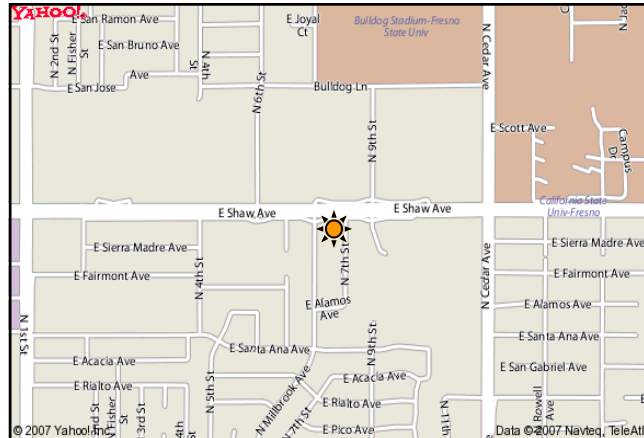

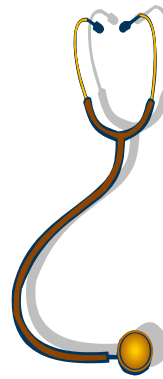

Public Health Nursing

- Health screening and risk assessments by a Public Health nurse.
- Education and prevention programs for hypertension, diabetes, obesity and HIV prevention.
- Case Management services



Access to Health Services

- Transportation services to and from appointments at Central Valley Indian Health and other community health organizations.
- The health Project has established agreements with various community clinics and providers for medical, dental and specialty care. The Case Management staff works with each client to determine their needs and the most appropriate location for services.
- Referral and/or application assistance for state insurance programs and other social services.
